The January 15, 2026, regular meeting of the Public Safety Committee was called to order at 4:00 p.m. by Chairperson Holmes.

AGENDA ADDITIONS AND CHANGES

Commissioner Toomey moved to approve the agenda with an amendment to move the Prosecutor's Office report up on the agenda to after the first Limited Public Comment. Commissioner Peek seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Commissioner Shaver moved to approve the December 4, 2025, meeting minutes as presented. Commissioner Peek seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

LIMITED PUBLIC COMMENT

PROSECUTOR'S OFFICE

Prosecuting Attorney Lloyd reported case load statistics for the month of December 2025. It was noted there are currently two murder trials underway.

SHERIFF'S OFFICE UPDATE

Sheriff Reich reported the highlights for the month of December 2025. Sheriff Reich announced the Mobile Command Unit has finally arrived after three years. He noted the purchase of this vehicle was made possible by funding received in 2023 by the State House and Senate Appropriations committees.

WINDSOR TOWNSHIP POLICE SERVICES AGREEMENT

Deputy Controller Dawson reported that the Windsor Township Board recently met to discuss entering into a 3-year contract that mirrors the Delta Township contract for police services. He noted we are unaware of the outcome. Discussion held. It was mentioned that a discussion regarding the continued funding of a School Resource Officer in the Waverly Community School District would need to occur in the near future. Commissioner Toomey moved to

recommend approval of the Windsor Township contract pending receipt of their Board's decision to the Ways and Means Committee. Commissioner Haskell seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

TRIAL COURTS

YOUTH FACILITY PHYSICIAN SERVICES PROPOSAL

Youth Facility Director Jeremy Mulvanny explained the amount of research and effort that has gone into locating a physician willing to provide the medical needs of those housed at the Youth Facility. Currently, a nurse from the Health Department visits once a week to provide the minimal required services. Director Mulvanny stated a physician has contacted him and is interested in serving the Youth Facility. They are working on a proposed contract to present at next month's Public Safety Committee. Discussion held.

CENTRAL DISPATCH UPDATE

Central Dispatch Deputy Director D'Huyvetter presented the department's monthly report. The No-Preference Wrecker Policy is under review by legal counsel, and the department hopes to have it ready for consideration at next month's meeting.

DELTA TOWNSHIP ALERT SYSTEM – INTERGOVERNMENTAL AGREEMENT

Phase 1 integration is moving forward.

Emergency Services Manager Wilkinson presented the department's monthly report.

None.

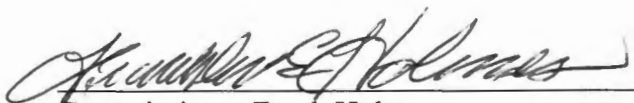
MISCELLANEOUS
