There were no changes to the proposed agenda.

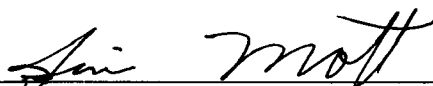
Anne Barna, Planning Director for the Barry-Eaton District Health Department was present to provide an update on the Department's vaccine administration. There was discussion regarding the federal distribution and state allocations for the identified Priority 1A population. There was also discussion regarding the recent announcement the Priority 1B population was eligible to begin receiving vaccinations. This announcement combined with supply limitations have created a large backlog for local health departments, including Barry-Eaton District Health Department, which as a result is unable to meet demand at the present time. It was reported that the Health Department is making arrangements to secure a supply of the Pfizer vaccine. Planning is ongoing for single day clinics. The Health Department is recruiting a large number of volunteers to staff these clinics.

A proposed semi-annual agency reporting schedule was distributed for the Committee's information and has been distributed to the agency Directors.

There was discussion regarding scheduling a meeting/presentation by the Court to provide information on the County and juvenile millage-funded programs.

Chairperson Mott adjourned the meeting at 9:46 a.m.
